From this – develop an emergency phone tree – cool to have (2) phone numbers – for if someone is out of town.

Debbie: land lines. Could it include our hot line? Or main land line phone #. Could it be put into a voice message. Somewhere that people could call and get recorded message listing meetings that have been cancelled.

Jeff – that is taking it even further. Developing a plan for the emergency, beyond just the contact.

Chitra: Witnessed during the fires discussion of people looking online to see if a meeting was still open.

Who is to say if a meeting can close? If 2 people show up it is a meeting. IF people show up then it is still a meeting. Not a fan of over-organization. Coming together during the time we are in need.

Jeff- it is not us telling them the meeting is not open. We are talking about the location... not the meeting. We cannot tell another group or meeting whether they can or cannot meet.

Angie: They call us and say our building is gone and we are moving the location. This is a website function.

Jeff: This has opened up a discussion. Let’s continue this. Bring the form and we’ll continue discussion.

Storage Unit: Pulling off for now. Not going to happen w/ Intergruop. Will have to clean out what is up in the Yountville locker. Need to clean it out and make more space.

Tradition Twelve: Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our Traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.

1. Why is it a good idea for me to place the common welfare of all AA members before individual welfare? What would happen to *me* if AA as a whole disappeared?
2. When I do not trust AA's current servants, who do I wish had the authority to straighten them out?
3. In my opinions of and remarks about other AAs, am I implying membership requirements other than a desire to stay sober?
4. Do I ever try to get a certain AA group to conform to *my* standards, not its own?
5. Have I a personal responsibility in helping an AA group fulfill its primary purpose? What is *my* part?
6. Does my personal behavior reflect the Sixth Tradition—or belie it?
7. Do I do all I can do to support AA financially? When is the last time I anonymously gave away a Grapevine subscription?
8. Do I complain about certain AAs' behavior—especially if they are paid to work for AA? Who made *me* so smart?
9. Do I fulfill all AA responsibilities in such a way as to please privately even my own conscience? Really?
10. Do my utterances always reflect the Tenth Tradition, or do I give AA critics real ammunition?
11. Should I keep my AA membership a secret, or reveal it in private conversation when that may help another alcoholic (and therefore me)? Is my brand of AA so attractive that other drunks want it?
12. What is the real importance of *me* among more than a million AAs?

Concept XII: The Conference shall observe the spirit of A.A. tradition, taking care that it never becomes the seat of perilous wealth or power; that sufficient operating funds and reserve be its prudent financial principle; that it place none of its members in a position of unqualified authority over others; that it reach all important decisions by discussion, vote, and, whenever possible, by substantial unanimity; that its actions never be personally punitive nor an incitement to public controversy; that it never perform acts of government, and that, like the Society it serves, it will always remain democratic in thought and action.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

All General Service commitments are for one panel (two years).

Eligibility: Officers are not eligible for positions that they have held for the entire previous panel, however officers who were elected to their positions during the last year of the previous panel are eligible.

Sobriety: At least two years of continuous sobriety is suggested.

Meetings: The District 11 Business meeting is held from 10 AM – 12 Noon in Section A, Lincoln Hall at the Vets home in Yountville on the first Saturday of each month, except when there is an Area Assembly. The Area Committee Meeting is held from 12:30 PM to 3:30 PM at the Petaluma Community Center (320

N. McDowell Blvd) on the fourth Saturday of each month, except in December when it is held on the 3rd Saturday. See the Area Web Site Home page called “About CNCA” at <http://www.CNCA06.org> for times and locations for Area Committee Meetings including PI/CPC, BTG, Archives, and DCM and DCMC Sharing Sessions.

DCM

Eligibility: Served as a GSR or Actively served as Alternate GSR for a panel. Current and past DCM's of the District are not eligible for this position unless they have rotated out for an entire Panel.

Meeting Expectations:

- Monthly District business meeting - expected
- Chairs their monthly Sub District Meeting - expected
- Monthly Officer's meetings - expected
- Voting member of the monthly Area Committee meeting in Petaluma - expected
- Voting member at the Area Assemblies (4 per year) – expected

Duties:

- Serve specific sub-district as liaison for groups and GSRs of that sub-district.
- Holds monthly sub-district meetings; helping GSRs learn and fulfill their roles by discussing the Twelve Concepts and Twelve Traditions, providing information on running business meetings, taking group consciences or inventories, and keeping their groups safe.
- Share information and ideas to support groups and resolve issues of the groups, by assisting the GSR.
- Disseminate information about current District, Area, Regional and World Conference issues.
- Facilitate group inventories when requested.
- Visit “dark meetings” – suggested.

BEGINNER'S MEETING CHAIR

- Keeps the District up to date regarding the meeting, including bringing any concerns to the District for discussion/action.
